### Day #1 | Malaysia [Kuala Lumpur]

### Day #2 | Malaysia SITER's Event

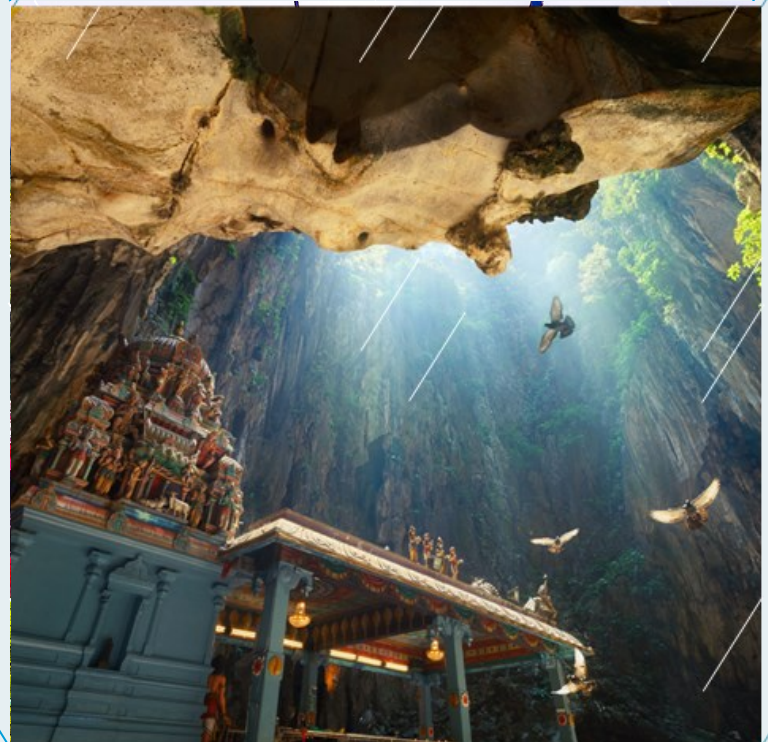
Today head to 'Spaces Exchange 106', Kuala Lumpur to attend the **SITER's Workshop on Data Analytics and Visualization + DP900 Microsoft Certification**.

You can go back to the hotel in the afternoon and take some rest.

#### What to do by Evening?

- Visit Malaysia's largest indoor theme park 'Berjaya Times Square' and Berjaya Times Square Mall (one of the largest in the world).
- If you like parties and nightlife, then head to Changkat Bukit Bintang nightlife zone. Here you can explore Resto Bars, snazzy nightclubs, whisky bars and lively Irish clubs.
- Walk around Bukit Bintang and see the local life and enjoy street foods.

Watching Petronas Twin Towers at night will be amazing. In the evening, visit and watch the Symphony Fountain Light Show [8 pm - 8.30 pm], in the backyard of Petronas Twin Towers, KLCC Park.

### Day #3 | Malaysia

*Batu Caves & Genting Highlands With Awana Skyway Cable Car Two Way Ride.*

After the breakfast from hotel, you can visit Batu Caves and Genting Highlands.

#### **Batu Caves [9 AM - 10.30 AM]**

Batu Caves is a limestone hill and a 100 year old temple, dedicated to Hindu Shrine Lord Muruga. Batu caves Murugan Statue is one of the largest in the world, it stands in front of 272 steps that lead to the cave entrance.

#### **Genting Highlands with Cable Car Ride [12 PM - 4 PM]**

Explore Genting Highlands and visit some of its attractions like 20th Century Fox World Malaysia, Casinos in Genting, SkySymphony Genting, Indoor Theme Park & Video Games Park, Food Courts, Shopping in First World Plaza/ SkyAvenue and Restaurants/ Bars in Genting Highlands.

By evening [7 pm], back to your hotel and enjoy the hotel amenities & dinner.

### Day #4 | Malaysia

*Bukit Bintang Shopping, Food, Massage & Nightlife*

You can spend full day at Bukit Bintang (Bintang Walk) with Shopping, street foods at Jalan Alor or partying in Changkat at Night.

Some of the shopping places are Berjaya Times Square, Imbi Plaza, Fahrenheit 88, Low Yat Plaza, Starhill Gallery, Sungei Wang Plaza, Lot 10 and Pavilion Kuala Lumpur. Bukit Bintang offering everything from shopping avenues, restaurants, street food, massage/spa and vibrant night clubs at Changkat Bukit Bintang area.

**As an alternative (optional),** you can visit KLCC Aquaria or Malaysia Chinatown on your own.

- Visit the largest Thean Hou Chinese Temple.
- Walk around Petaling Street Chinatown shopping district and do shopping or taste Street Foods of India, Chinese or Malaya.
- You may also go to Central Market, Kasturi Walk Flea Market and Central Market Foot Court for lunch.
- Go for a Chinese Massage at Chinatown.
- Visit Chinatown temples such as Chan See Shu Yuen Temple and Kuan Yi Temple.



### Day #5 | Malaysia

*Departure from Kuala Lumpur*

Leave Kuala Lumpur with great memories as per the flight timing. Official hotel check out time: 12 pm. You can proceed to Kuala Lumpur International Airport to catch your flight.

### Recommended Transportation

**Public Transport Recommendation for Day 1 and Day 2:** If you are coming to Kuala Lumpur through KLIA or KLIA2 international airports, you may want to purchase the KL TravelPass that will allow you to travel on KLIA Express Airport Transfer, MRT, LRT and Monorail. We recommend you take KL TravelPass Return and enjoy the up and down airport trip using KLIA Express Train Airport Transfer and 2 days unlimited rides on LRT, MRT and KL Monorail Lines.

**Public Transport Recommendation for Day 3, Day 4 & Day 5:** Take a 3-days MyCity Pass which is very cheaper and affordable. MyCity Pass is an unlimited travel pass that offers an unlimited ride on Rapid KL LRT, MRT, Monorail, BRT, Rapid KL bus and MRT feeder bus services.

#### **What is the alternative of Public Transport?**

Install 'Grab' all-in-one app for the local taxi booking. Use a taxi if you are in a group of 2-4 people which is economical. Otherwise, you can depend on public transport to save some expenses.

### Points to be considered while preparing your travel checklist

- Book flights early in advance.
- Visa is free for the trip to Malaysia in 2024 for most nationalities.
- Buy a tourist sim card on arrival in Kuala Lumpur International Airport.
- Buy a travel insurance from your home country prior to your trip to Malaysia.
- Pack a small baggage (approx. < 10 kg) for the comfort travel.
- Ensure the hotels are paid in advance prior to your travel.

### Tips & Advise

- Take a Travel Insurance for your safety and security. Contact us for the better travel insurance advise.
- Travel in a Group and cut-down your expenses. You can invite your friends and colleagues for a trip with you.
- Book your flight tickets early in advance to reduce the chance of increasing flight ticket costs.
- Confirm your seat at SITER Event before proceeding with the flight or hotel booking.
